

- Clear Communication: Communication is key when planning a wedding. Be open and honest with your vendors, bridesmaids, and partner.
 Pictures are an amazing way to show people what you do and don't love!

Keep It Simple

When planning a wedding, it's natural to feel a little overwhelmed but that doesn't mean the process has to be anything less than enjoyable. Take it back to basics and think about what you want YOUR day to be!

Budget - Sit down together and set a realistic budget for your day!

Your vision - Remember those dreams you had as a kid? Don't let those dreams fade away, but factor in your partners hopes and dreams for the day too!

Delegate: If your friends and family offer to help with your wedding preparations, take them up on it! People love to help, and this is one of those times you're best to accept the help! Maybe leave your wild-card friend out for this one though.

Back-Up Plan: Most of us plan for mid 20's sunshine with a little bit of a cool breeze for our weddings. Unfortunately very few of us win the wedding weather jackpot! Plan for the worst case scenario and hope that you don't have to use it! Imagine you're getting hitched in your rainy-weather backup hall - is it what you envisioned or could it use a bit of love?

Choosing Vendors: It's important to establish a relationship with your vendors. Set up a meeting/phone call with them and take the time to ask all the questions you need to feel comfortable. Make sure you have the same vision & vibe as them!

Bridal party - The ones you've been through it all with. You know they'll be there when the nerves kick in or to wipe your tears away, not just for the partying!

Guest list - Invite those you couldn't spend the day without; don't let pressure from family & friends get to you on this one. If an elopements more your thing, definitely don't let pressure from family & friends get to you!





Do's & Dont's

- 9. Don't forget to have fun and enjoy the celebration


Children At Weddings

Outdoor Ceremonies

Outdoor ceremonies are stunning. I've seen some magnificent back drops: kilometres of lush rainforest; rolling mountains; fog rolling through the trees & around the alter; even Mount Warning right behind the bride and groom.

When you're planning your outdoor ceremony, you'll need to factor in the possibility of harsh sunlight and the possibility of pouring rain.

Harsh Sunlight and How to Combat it:

The mid-day sun can create harsh and unflattering shadows, which can be especially problematic if you're standing directly in the sunlight. To avoid this issue, one solution is to position the ceremony in a way that the officiant or altar is back-lit by the sun. This will create more even light and prevent harsh shadows from falling on the couple's faces.

Another consideration for outdoor ceremonies is the presence of spotted light, which can occur when sunlight filters through trees or other objects. To eliminate this issue, consider having the ceremony in a shaded area, such as under a canopy or a large tree. This will create more even lighting and prevent harsh shadows from forming.

What to do when it's raining on your day:

There's two main options here. First off, having a plan B is your best bet. Making sure it's a place you'd be HAPPY to get married, somewhere that is as equally beautiful as your outdoor location. This is a MUST. If you go into your wedding with realistic expectations, you likely aren't going to be disappointed.

Your second option: I've photographed this a few times (and i personally LOVE it) is umbrellas (genius, right?)! Have enough clear umbrellas (or matching umbrellas) on hand for your guests and continue your wedding outside as planned. There's something wildly romantic about photos out in the rain, and a love that withstands even the roughest storms. Plus, the photos turn out GORGEOUS!!





Your Timeline

We go over & fine tune your timeline together to ensure you're making the most of your photography/videography time that you've booked us for. We take into account your planned reception time, the golden hour & sunset time on your special day, and how long you've booked us for so you're truly making the most out of this investment!

Some important factors to consider when making your timeline:

- Always have a realistic timeline of your day some things will always take longer than expected but some things will be quicker. Being flexible on this is key for the smooth running of your day
- Enlist help; having someone in charge of gathering your guests for the group photos directly after the ceremony will help keep the timeline on track
- Make a list of your group photos you'd like on the day (with family and friends before you're whisked away for your bridal portraits) and bear in mind you'll be in these photos and they can take up to 30 minutes
- Factor in your sunset time when considering your reception start time! The lighting right before sunset is MAGIC and you will get photos you'll cherish forever during this time
- When photographing Bride/Groom prep, we normally allocate 30-45 minutes for the guys and up to 2 hours for the girls. Having all of your important details set aside will save us time when we arrive and allow more time for photographing pre-wedding jitters! Bride think dress, shoes, bouquet, perfume, ring, jewellery, sentimental belongings, wedding invitations, bridesmaid dresses & any presents. Grooms think suits, ties, shoes, belts, cologne, rings, buttonholes, socks & any presents
- Reception If you get your formalities out of the way sooner, then you can get down to partying the night away sooner
- Think about having a sparkler first dance instead of a sparkler exit!
 This way, your guests will still all be at full energy and involved.
 Towards the end of the night, your guests may be feeling tired or may have started peeling off to take the kids home and the photos may not have the same energy

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Unplugged Ceremonies


Unplugged ceremonies are becoming the new normal, and wedding photographers around the world are sighing with relief!


It's your day and everything should be 100% how you want it, so if you want your guests to photograph you during the ceremony, that's totally your call! But if you're on the fence or you haven't really given it any thought before now, here's a couple of benefits:

- Guests get to experience your wedding through their own eyes and not through their camera phone
- When you get back your professional wedding photos and video, they won't be spoiled with dozens of arms anchoring their phones into the aisles to get photos of you that, will probably get lost in the black hole of their iphone photo folder

If you're keen on unplugged, here's how you can enforce it politely to your guests:

- Having the celebrant speak out to all of the guests prior to the ceremony beginning and asking your guests to keep their phones in their pockets (you can even go one further here and get the celebrant to ask your guests not to post any photos of you online before you do!)
- Having a welcome sign that asks guests to keep their phones to themselves until after the ceremony





The Morning Of

Wedding days can be stressful, which is why it's important to try and stay relaxed and calm in the morning leading up to the ceremony. Here's some tips to help you stay relaxed:

- 1. Wake up early: Give yourself plenty of time in the morning to get ready without feeling rushed or stressed. Try to wake up at least 4 hours before the ceremony so you have time to eat, get ready, and relax
- 2. Practice deep breathing or meditation: Take a few minutes to yourself to practice deep breathing or meditation. This can help calm your nerves and clear your mind before the chaos of the day
- 3. Eat a healthy breakfast: It's important to fuel your body with a healthy breakfast to keep your energy levels up throughout the day. Try to eat something light and nutritious, such as fruit, yogurt, or whole grain toast

Pets & Weddings




